Revd Nick Williams

Brothers and Sister's in Christ, just a few lines to introduce myself to those I haven't as yet met as the new Rector of The Orwell and Deben Rural Benefice which includes St Mary and St Martin at Kirton. My Name is Nick Williams, I came to this Benefice from a small semi rural benefice of two churches where I looked after the spiritual needs of about 18,000 people in the Diocese of Rochester. Before that I looked after three churches in the Darent Valley just outside Dartford also in the Diocese of Rochester. Prior to ordination I spent thirty years as Metropolitan Police officer serving in South and Central London. I led for the Met Police on Gypsy and Traveller issues but spent the last few years of my career working in a specialist role at New Scotland Yard.

I'm married with two allegedly grown up sons, one at university and one soon leaving us to join the army. My wife is a teacher specialising in Primary and early years work and has been for many years a SENCO in a large primary school. She is also a dyslexia assessor and enjoys working with children who have additional needs.

South Suffolk is a new venture for us as a family although we have had a family home on the Norfolk/Suffolk border for some years so the unique Suffolk outlook on life is not a complete surprise to us. Whilst I have only been in post for two months we have already fallen in love with the area and are really enjoying exploring everything it has to offer.

In my spare time I am an enthusiastic Naval Historian and feel blessed to have Churches with a 'Trafalgar Grave' in the Churchyard as well as monuments to the great Naval family 'the Brooke's" and even a monument to arguably one of the greatest yet unacknowledged naval heroes of his time Admiral Vernon. I also enjoy cooking at which I am as enthusiastic and undistinguished a practitioner as I am a historian.

As you know more than I we have a wonderful set of communities in the villages that make up our benefice and I am looking forward to meeting as many of you as possible as I settle in to being your Rector. I would like our churches to become even more involved with the communities around them than they already are and would enjoin you to keep and eye on your parish notice boards, webpages and facebook pages for some of the new services and events beginning this year.

To close I just want to say that I and the Churches are here for each and every one of you irrespective of age, gender, ethnicity, sexuality, faith or anything else and I look forwarding to walking with you as we explore new ways to use them.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

World Day of Prayer Service - Friday 1st March 2024 Methodist Chapel, Kirton at 2.30 pm

Each year the service for the World Day of Prayer is written by women from a different country and this is an opportunity to hear about the thoughts, hopes, concerns and prayers from other communities. The World Day of Prayer is celebrated in 146 countries; it begins in Samoa and travels though Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Europe and the Americas before finishing in American Samoa.

These services are prepared at least a year before the service date and this year it is particularly poignant as our service has been written by the Christian women of Palestine with the title 'I beg you, bear with one another in love'. To find out more about the lives of women in Palestine please do join us at the Methodist Chapel on Friday 1st March at 2.30pm.

Disability Advice Service

The Disability Advice Service (East Suffolk) have been working across the East Suffolk and Ipswich communities for 37 years supporting children and adults with disability related problems, including their family carers. We provide practical solutions to address the short and long term financial issues which often underly or worsen the well-being of our clients.

This case study provides more insight into the kind of support we can provide.

Janice (not her real name) suffers from severe fibromyalgia (resulting in poor mobility) and anxiety. She came to DAS for help with her Personal Independence Payment (PIP) application, which resulted in a successful award at that time. Unfortunately the standard third year review downgraded her award despite there being no improvement in her condition. Additionally at that time the client had left an abusive relationship and was feeling very lost. Also significant was that she was wasn't familiar with how to manage her finances.

Once notified, DAS kicked off the appeals process on Janice's behalf, and provided support for her during a 10 week wait for the outcome. During that period we became increasingly concerned about her increasing stress level, particularly as this delay weighed heavily on top of her wider financial struggles.

In order to get Janice through this difficult time DAS was able to provide urgent crisis support with grants and vouchers, as well as undertaking a wider benefits check to see if client was entitled to any other forms of financial support.

The client's biggest concern was paying her household utility bills, and DAS were able to access the Suffolk Household Support Fund to help pay for them. We also then guided her through what she needed to do to maximise her income and benefits until her full disability benefits were reinstated, which thankfully they were! Janice is now happily managing and grateful for the help provided.

probably a dim and distant memory, I must just mention the speaker at our Christmas party. Carolina Helman the speaker at our Christmas party, Caroline Holmes, who talked very animatedly about the poison garden at Alnwick. Her enthusiasm for plants and her knowledge? of the area was very infectious. So many everyday plants we all have in our gardens also have the potential to harmful if treated wrongly, but Caroline



added some more exotic species and stories to the mix. Any budding crime writers missed a treat to supplement their plot lines.

Our programme secretary Jenny Bearcroft has pulled together another interesting programme for 2024, starting next month with pests and diseases, but then going on to cover diverse gardening topics such as Irises, gardening for beginners, blooms of the Balearics, and the best plants for September colour along with our usual summer evening visits to local gardens and nurseries. Something for everyone be you a seasoned gardener or an absolute beginner so do come along what ever size your garden or horticultural ability. The next talk is 7.30pm on in the village hall on 8th February. Gail Bosley from the animal and plant health agency will be talking about pests and diseases ,After last year I think we all need her advice.

This year the club are also planning a short 4 day break from 18th to 21st July to see the RHS Flower Show at Tatton Court, as well as visit the new RHS Bridgewater Garden, the award winning Trentham Gardens and Biddulph Grange, a grade 1 listed Victorian garden. These have been on my to do list for a while so I cant wait to go, and departing from the green what could be easier? If you are interested in joining the trip please contact Jo Shaw or another committee member.

Well as February is upon us there are plenty of jobs including lots of pruning, sowing and planting to be doing in the garden already:

Prune late winter flowering clematis, cutting stems back to buds about 30cm from the base and prune winter blooming shrubs such as mahonia, winter jasmine and heathers once they have finished flowering. Buddleia can be cut to the base to keep it to a reasonable size.

Cut down deciduous ornamental grasses left standing over the winter before fresh shoots appear.

On the allotment chit first early potato tubers and prepare veg beds to sowing by weeding and then adding a thick layer of garden compost

Put cloches or fleece over strawberries to start them into growth and encourage an early crop

Sow sweet peas in deep pots and keep them frost-free in a greenhouse or on a sunny windowsill or if you were organised last autumn pot on and pinch out those autumn-sown sweet peas to encourage side shoots to form

Sow tender crops such as tomatoes and on a warm sunny windowsill

So don't just sit there, Put on a coat and get out in the garden. I'm sure if you are anything like me the first couple of sessions will leave you very stiff the next day or longing for a hot soak, but how lovely to get out in the fresh air and how mentally satisfying get a head of some of those jobs. Wont that feel good? Spring is on its way.

K & F Parish Council

The January meeting was attended by 10 Councillors, the RFO, PTLO a District Councillor and 2 parishioners. The Council had been advised that there had been a change in the local Police Constable; PC Nicola Burnham-Slipper has replaced PC Partridge.

Mr Ninnmey (DC) gave an update on the NE Felixstowe Garden Neighbourhood project which was to be the subject of a meeting later in the month. A written report highlighted Pitstop Project, Planning Triple Lock and the One Direction Strategic Plan.

No request for an election having been lodged the Council will be required to fill the Falkenham Councillor vacancy by co-option; suggested nominations for candidates or even volunteers should be forwarded to the Clerk or Chairman.

The Council together with parishioners had submitted complaints to SCC about the flooding on Falkenham Road, no direct responses had been received but some work appeared to have been actioned. Work on enhancing Parish Communication and progressing the Joint Cross Parish Group continue.

One planning application was considered but did not raise any objections. Mr Hatrick (PTLO) had nothing to report on bus services.

The Chairman on behalf of the Council thanked the Clerk, Colin Shaw, who was retiring at the end of January, for his 31 years of service as the Parish Clerk., which was followed by a presentation of a flowering tree and a spending voucher. The Clerk thanked them for their generosity and accorded his best wishes to his successor, Graham Walker (RFO); much had changed since 1992, Colin Shaw, Clerk


